ORGAN CRAWL AND ANNUAL DINNER MEETING SUNDAY, MAY 2

The Cleveland Chapter AGO Annual Dinner Meeting will be held on Sunday, May 2, at First Congregational Church, 47 Aurora St., in Hudson.

Instead of a recital or musical event preceding the dinner and meeting this year, the afternoon's informal program will be an Organ Crawl, allowing members to see, hear, and play, (if they wish), the organ at First Congregational, and the organ at neighboring Christ Church Episcopal, immediately next door to First Congregational.

The Organ Crawl portion of the afternoon will begin at 4:00 p.m. at Christ Church Episcopal, 21 Aurora St., Hudson, with Nicole Keller, Organist and Choirmaster at Christ Church, as our host. We will then move next door to First Congregational, with First Congregational's Organist Charles Carr as our host. We will remain, then, at First Congregational for the dinner.

As stated above, the Organ Crawl will begin at 4:00 p.m., and we expect to spend approximately 45 minutes with each instrument. That would mean moving to First Congregational at approximately 4:45 p.m., with the dinner commencing at approximately 5:30 p.m., if there are those who would be joining us only for the dinner and meeting portion of the afternoon and evening.

The dinner, as in previous years, will be a buffet by caterer Janet Cutlip. The Annual Meeting and installation of next year's officers and Executive Committee members will follow. The evening usually concludes between 7:00 and 7:30 pm.

The Organ Crawl portion of the afternoon will be a joint program with the Akron AGO Chapter, so we hope many of their members will be joining us. We have also invited any who wish to do so to make dinner reservations and stay to eat with us.

Cost for the dinner is once again \$20 per person, and spouses, partners, and guests are most welcome! Worship at FLAWR will feature a wide variety of liturgical expressions ranging from traditional Anglican Morning Prayer to Jazz Vespers. Workshops, lectures, and masterclasses are offered to provide small group sessions focused on specific topics. Panel discussions are designed to allow Festival participants an opportunity for open, honest discussion on liturgical issues.

MASTER CLASS WITH TOM TRENNEY

Tom Trenney led a Master Class on Saturday morning, February 20, at First Baptist Church in Shaker Heights. Two stunning CIM organ students of Todd Wilson played for the class. Dana Steele played Dupre's "Prelude and Fugue in B Major." Patrick Parker played a movement from Vierne's "Second Symphony." Both played very well and Tom's suggestions were well received. One comment that I found especially helpful was to make each and every phrase as wonderful as possible. This is a challenge! Sometimes we play the same repertoire over and over and become complacent in our playing....we can do better!

Following the Master Class, Tom offered a second hour called "Abracadabra" - Magically making Music in the Moment. He offered great guidelines for improvising, primarily with hymn tunes. He made many helpful suggestions.

Please consider attending master classes when they are offered! I always learn something new and gain a new appreciation for the music we all love to play! Thanks to Tom, Todd Wilson and Bob Schneider, host.

HISTORIC ORGAN

Dear Cleveland AGO,

As a member of the chapter and member of St. John's United Church of Christ in Dover, Ohio, I wanted to share with you a unique and historic organ.

When I was 15, and I am now 37, I began playing the pipe organ on our church's 1881 / 1938 Vottleler-Holtkamp pipe organ. It is a RARE and beautiful site in the church! Several hundred metal and wooden pipes from the 1881 Vottleler organ were incorporated into the "new" Holtkamp organ of 1938. The organ has two tall and wide cases, one on each side of the front choir nave. The open 16 foot pedal pipes are on each side, in the front, with the Great and pedal in the right loft and the Positiv and Swell on the left.

The organ has the original oak and maple casework, action, and pipework. The only things done to the organ over the last 128 / 71 years were general cleaning, tuning, and in about 2005, the original

console was kept, but renovated with new and additional thumb / toe pistons, console cleaning, new electronic parts, and added a programmable Crescendo / Sequencer. Releathering and pipe removal and cleaning was also performed by the Holtkamp Organ Company of Cleveland, Ohio.

This organ is a remarkable salvation of both eras. Over 128 years, then 71 years since 1938, the original casework and pipework remains intact with no additions or alterations, is fully playable, and a true site to see. While I cannot speak for the church Elders, please feel free to give them a call, or simply call to stop by. This would be an amazing instrument for members to see!

It all began in 1986 for me at the age of 15. On that very organ, before I was 18, I learned to play J. S. Bach's Toccata in D Minor BWV 565, his 8 short Preludes and Fugues, Prelude and Fugue in C, its variants, and many other wonderful organ works. I played in two musical concerts that included the use of the pipe organ, and as a then member of the Canton chapter in the 1980's and 90's, and now the Cleveland AGO to present date, the memories of playing and learning on this fantastic and extremely rare unaltered 1881 / 1938 pipe organ have been a passion for me. The church is also lucky to have had the same organist from the mid 1950's to present. I also have wonderful pictures of this fine instrument, and was even married in St. John's UCC with the organ works of J.S. Bach being played.

May we always remember the words of J.S. Bach in this famous quote: "The aim and final end of all music should be none other than the glory of God and the refreshment of the soul." We, as organists, know that very feeling. It's a remarkable passion and a unique way to connect with God. May God always bless our fine Guild and chapter.
