You are invited to the **Festival of Liturgical Arts of the Western Reserve (FLAWR)**, a five-day synthesis of worship, workshops, discussions and master classes for musicians and clergy devoted to the continual development of their craft. FLAWR was created to bring together preachers, teachers, musicians and artists to share their unique gifts in the creation of liturgies that reflect the beauty and splendor of God.

Musicians meet together frequently. Preachers meet together frequently. But in very few instances are all of these leaders brought together to create, disseminate, discuss, and wrestle with the issues of how and why we do what we do. We believe this is our niche: passionate, creative and honest dialogue across the liturgical disciplines.

Worship at FLAWR will feature a wide variety of liturgical expressions ranging from traditional Anglican Morning Prayer to Jazz Vespers.
