JANUARY MEETING:

The January meeting will be a morning of workshops on Saturday, January 26, 2008 at Rocky River United Methodist Church, 19414 Detroit Road, Rocky River with Jeff Acker and Carmen Massaro, hosts. We will gather at 9:00 AM for a social time, coffee and pastries. There will be two workshop times with two concurrent sessions taking place at each.

The workshops will be (in no particular order):

Conducting from the console – Jim Riggs

Cue the tenors, general 4, a page turn, oh no--- HELP! □ Conducting from the console can be challenging. □ This session will address some of these challenges as well as offer some hands on suggestions for improving your conducting skills at the organ.

Choral Reading Session – Dave Powers

The choral reading session will feature general literature for the church year. It will include a blend of older and new titles, and will try to include 2 and 3 part voicings for smaller choirs.

How To Accompany Contemporary Tunes on the Organ – Chris Toth

Chris believes that the organ is an extremely effective instrument to use to accompany congregational singing of contemporary tunes. This workshop will cover reasons to use the organ, techniques to develop appealing accompaniments, registration and sample accompaniments. Bring a troubling tune with you, if you would like!

The Bach Collection

Marcellene and Walter Mayhall will create an interesting and revealing display of first printings of Bach's major keyboard works – the Well-Tempered Clavier, Toccatas, Suites and first editions of the St. Matthew Passion, the B minor Mass, the Orgelmesse as well as 18th and early 19th century editions of Handel, Haydn and Corelli.

Then at 11:30 we will gather in the sanctuary to hear our two scholarship winners play. They are Chiawen Wu and Mark Heiskanen.

“Thanks for the Memories....” How Sweet it is?

One of my ‘churches’ wanted some memories of my experience there and I wrote up a sentence which somehow wormed itself into a page of memories which inspired my memories of church positions gone by.

I remember Mama, (no, no, no...wrong story.) Well, yes I do remember Mom who sang and sat me down at the piano and ‘made’ me learn how to accompany her solos which she sang at church, meetings and clubs. In elementary school I was one of thirty kids in a ‘piano class’ and in high school I accompanied the choirs, learning as I experienced playing around. When fifteen I finally started piano lessons at CIM, a real shocker as I had to learn scales, theory, etc. and listen to others playing weird exercises, scales and strange music by Bach (which I pronounced Batch.) Someone heard me play and hired me to play at a church held every Sunday at the Cleveland Hotel and I discovered a world shattering event that being ‘hired’ meant I was being paid. Mom was thrilled and trilled the news all over town which ended in more playing and even teaching piano.

When in college at Mather (CWRU) on music scholarships, I was hired by a Presbyterian Church to play and direct a choir. Dick and I were married there by a wonderful Minister (who still continues to call every year on our wedding day.) It was a good experience, one I thought was it. However, a Methodist Church was next as associate organist, and director of youth choirs. However the main attraction was that it had a REAL pipe organ, something I knew about at my lessons at Old Stone Church. However, that job eventually got into an undertow so that I had to leave, learning that organ pipes were not the only ones full of air. It was a great experience as I was determined to study while attending Trinity Cathedral where Dick was soloist in the choir.

Auditions were being held the Olmsted Community Church and Dick said GO! When I arrived there to practice, I was lost trying to find the sanctuary, much more the organ. However, I did find the secretary who led me to the yellow brick door and being consoled to finally find the console, plus the settings of the Casavant Organ, I began to play Bach. But being stunned at the beauty and power of the instrument, I stopped mid-way, and broke into the Doxology in total gratitude of such a little farm town investing in such an instrument. My whole life passed through my brain: Mom, school, church jobs, pianos, scales.

real pipes, and getting clumsy feet to play as ordered: (TOES ONLY PLEASE!). It is a total love affair lasting over forty years. Even when the pipes reacted to the fluctuating temperature, and planes roaring just inches above the steeple, Dick, and son Ted and others climbed up and down the thin wood trails and tuned to my heart’s content.

Being wary of ministers (even though both my grandfathers were ministers) I remember the pastor whose ministry there was so supportive and important to me. Once, in tears, I asked him...’How does one forgive a person you love who has deeply hurt you’...and his quiet, thoughtful reply: “Forgiveness is when the person is more important than the deed.” Forever since, in my work and in my life, that reply has been my mantra.
