QUIMBY COMPETITION

We have received notification from our Regional Councilor, David Lamb, that our application to hold a Quimby Regional Competition for the Young Organist has been accepted. Our competition will be held on Saturday, March 23 at Fairmount Presbyterian Church. Bob Moncrief is the coordinator of that competition. There will be eight local competitions in our region- more than any other region and two more than the published maximum. Special dispensation was given to Region V to have the extra competitions due to the high level of interest by local chapters. This means the competitiveness will be particularly high in our region. Our chapter has traditionally sponsored a good share of winners in the Region and we expect high level applicants as usual. Students can apply for the competition in either their home or school chapter.
