There are two opportunities for members to give a gift to the AGO this season. We hope you will consider a gift to the Chapter. The first is to the AGO Scholarship Fund. See Carol Neff's letter below in this regard. The Executive Committee has set a goal of \$2,000 for the fund this year. For years the expectation has been that proceeds of the Chapter Investment Account would be used for this purpose but as you know investments are producing little income at this time. We just need to step up and annually fund through our gifts this important work of the AGO. The suggested donation to the scholarship fund is \$20. If you can do more, we thank you.

A second place for gifts to the AGO is through the funding of one or a part of one of the prizes for the Regional Young Artist Competition. We will be hosting our chapter competition in March. The winner of our local competition will go on to the Regional level competition in June. We have a good track of record of our local winners who go on to win at the Regional level. The prize levels for the competition are \$500: first prize, \$300; second prize; and third prize, \$200. In addition

the winner will receive from the Chapter funds to attend and compete at the Regional Competition. We are seeking named prize donors for the various prizes. A prize could be given by one individual or company or by several individuals pooling their gifts. I would be happy to discuss various options with you if you are interested.
