THIS WEEK IN CLASSICAL MUSIC HISTORY



John Stainer

On this date in 1840 English organist and composer John Stainer was born. He became organist at St. Paul's Cathedral in London where he was influential to future generations of Anglican musicians. His organ method, simply titled, The Organ, was a staple of organ teaching for many years. His work is not much performed these days except his passion oratorio, The Crucifixion, the ever-popular God So Loved the World and the Seven-fold Amen.
