Johann Sebastian Bach was born on March 21st 1685, the son of Johann Ambrosius, court trumpeter for the Duke of Eisenach and director of the musicians of the town of Eisenach in Thuringia. How can we organists be other than in awe at this event and rejoice in the life of our beloved composer of music for the organ? If you can't attend one of the birthday events, do sit down at the organ play some of his music in his honor. Here is a quote from the master:

The aim and final end of all music should be none other than the glory of God and the refreshment of the soul.
